Te Kāinga Ako and Te Haerenga Ako






Te Kāinga Ako me Te Haerenga Ako are designed so our tamariki are supported to thrive in their authentic ways of being.



Our Philosophy

Our philosophy represents all the voices that we, as a learning community, feel shape our tamariki in their being and in their learning.




Our Values

Ta Kāinga Ako thereby guides our philopshy; "I am at the centre of my learning. My learning is built upon the foundations of my culture. My learning is supported by the walls of my family and teachers. My learning is protected by the roof of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and our Centre Philosophy."

All learning, planning and assessment is based upon Te Kāinga Ako - in this way we, as kaiako, are ensuring the learning of our tamariki is meaningful, personalised to their culture and whānau, and upholds their mana as tangata whenua or tangata tiriti.

Tuakiri My identity and culture Te Kāinga Ako sits at the heart of all assessment and planning for tamariki at Kids Reserve - Taonga Tamariki.

Our tamariki identified that for them, Kids Reserve is a home. We wanted our assessment and planning to honour this sentiment. Te Kāinga Ako has been developed in response to our strategic plan, embodying the values we hold as a learning community for our tamariki in their learning and wellbeing.

This mahi is completed in consultation with whānau. This will be updated yearly at Matariki to honour Hiwa-i-te-rangi as we set aspirations for the year to come.



Te Haerenga Ako

Te Haerenga Ako are a pathway of learning that follow a four month timeframe.

All learning, planning and assessment is linked to Te Kāinga Ako - everything comes back to Te Kāinga Ako - meaning everything comes back to the child, their identity, and who they are - in this way we, as kaiako, are ensuring the learning of our tamariki is meaningful, personalised to their culture and whānau, and upholds their mana as tangata whenua and tangata tiriti.

The Haerenga Ako follow a pattern across four months: Notice, Notes, Evaluate:

Te Haerenga Ako flow throughout our year, capturing the learning interests of our tamariki, the aspirations of our whānau, and the teaching of our kaiako.

Te Haerenga Ako capture learning across a four month timeframe, enabling tamariki, whānau, and kaiako to delve deeply into a learning interest, to extend and support broad learning, to capture meaningful learning and exploration, and to assess learning outcomes for tamariki.

Te Haerenga Ako have been developed by kaiako as an extension form our learning story model to capture deeper learning and teaching here at Kids Reserve - Taonga Tamariki.




Kōrero - narrative, story

This is the big write-up part where the kaiako really shows their knowledge or learning, extension and frameworks.


